## DECLARATION OF EMERGENCY

### DIRECTIVE 011

**WHEREAS**, on March 12, 2020, I, Steve Sisolak, Governor of the State of Nevada issued a Declaration of Emergency to facilitate the State's response to the COVID-19 pandemic; and

**WHEREAS**, on March 13, 2020, Donald J. Trump, President of the United States declared a nationwide emergency pursuant to Sec. 501(b) of the Robert T. Stafford Disaster Relief and Emergency Assistance Act, 42 U.S.C. 5121-5207 (the "Stafford Act"); and

**WHEREAS**, pursuant to NRS 414.070(6), the Governor may exercise the power "[t]o authorize providers of emergency medical services and providers of mental health services who are not licensed, certified or registered, as applicable, in this State but hold a license, certificate, registration or similar credential in good standing in another state of the United States, the District of Columbia, the Commonwealth of Puerto Rico or any territory or insular possession subject to the jurisdiction of the United States to practice their profession within their scope of practice as if they were licensed, certified or registered, as applicable, in this State for the amount of time necessary to assist in responding to the emergency or disaster;" and

**WHEREAS**, pursuant to NRS 414.070(7), the Governor may perform and exercise such other functions, powers and duties as are necessary to promote and secure the safety and protection of the civilian population; and

**WHEREAS**, NRS 414.110(1) provides that all functions under Chapter 414 and all other activities relating to emergency management are hereby declared to be governmental functions. Neither the State nor any political subdivision thereof nor other agencies of the State or political subdivision thereof, nor except in cases of willful misconduct, gross negligence, or bad faith, any worker complying with or reasonably attempting to comply with this chapter, or any order or regulation adopted pursuant to the provisions of this chapter, or pursuant to any ordinance relating to any necessary emergency procedures or other precautionary measures enacted by any political subdivision of the State, is liable for the death of or injury to persons, or for damage to property, as a result of any such activity.

**WHEREAS**, NRS 414.110(2) provides that any requirement for a license to practice any professional, mechanical or other skill does not apply to any authorized worker who, in the course of performing

his or her duties as such, practices that professional, mechanical or other skill during an emergency or disaster.

**WHEREAS**, NRS 414.110(3) defines “worker” to include without limitation any full-time or part-time paid, volunteer or auxiliary employee of this State, of any political subdivision thereof, of other states, territories, possessions or the District of Columbia, of the Federal Government, of any neighboring country, or of any political subdivision thereof, or of any agency or organization, performing services for emergency management at any place in this State subject to the order or control of, or pursuant to a request of, the State Government or any political subdivision thereof; and

**WHEREAS**, Nevada must be prepared to expand its health care workforce to protect its citizens who require emergency care and services and ensure all critical medical resources are available to identify and treat those impacted by COVID-19 during this emergency;

**WHEREAS**, Article 5, Section 1 of the Nevada Constitution provides: “The supreme executive power of this State, shall be vested in a Chief Magistrate who shall be Governor of the State of Nevada;” and

**NOW THEREFORE**, by the authority vested in me as Governor by the Constitution and the laws of the State of Nevada and the United States, and pursuant to the March 12, 2020, Emergency Declaration,

IT IS HEREBY ORDERED THAT:

SECTION 1: The waiver of licensing provision of NRS 414.110 is hereby invoked. Professional licensing boards regulating providers of medical services shall temporarily waive certain licensing requirements to allow the practice of currently unlicensed skilled medical professionals during the pendency of the COVID-19 crisis. For the purposes of this Directive, a provider of medical services includes all categories of skilled personnel deemed necessary by the Governor’s COVID-19 Medical Advisory Team to augment and bolster Nevada’s healthcare workforce to the levels necessary to combat this pandemic, including without limitation, medical doctors, physician assistants, nurse practitioners, advanced practice registered nurses, registered nurses, licensed practical nurses, emergency medical technicians, advanced emergency medical technicians, respiratory care practitioners, paramedics, pharmacists, pharmacy technicians, medical students, nursing students, medical laboratory directors or technicians, and licensed or certified behavioral health professionals.

SECTION 2: The waiver and exemption of professional licensing requirements shall apply to qualified providers of medical services during this declared emergency who currently hold a valid license in good standing in another state, providers of medical services whose licenses currently stand suspended for licensing fee delinquencies, providers of medical services whose licenses currently stand suspended for failure to meet continuing medical education requirements, and providers of medical services who have retired from their practice in any state with their license in good standing. These waivers and exemptions shall not apply to persons whose licenses have been revoked or voluntarily surrendered as a result of disciplinary proceedings.

- SECTION 3: The Chief Medical Officer is authorized to approve the waiver and exemption of professional licensing requirements for any provider of medical services who has received training in another country but is not currently licensed in the United States, subject to verification of their credentials.
- SECTION 4: Individuals seeking waiver and exemption of professional licensing requirements are required to notify the applicable Nevada licensing board or agency and provide any requested information. Any medical facility as defined by NRS 449.0151, laboratory, or pharmacy employs or contracts with a provider of emergency medical services who is not licensed in Nevada during this declared emergency must ensure that the provider has notified the applicable Nevada license board or agency.
- SECTION 5: The Chief Medical Officer and, to the extent necessary, the appropriate professional licensing board shall expedite the processing and final disposition of all applications to practice under the terms of this Directive.
- SECTION 6: A provider of medical services during this emergency is authorized to supervise students in their profession to provide any emergency medical services as is appropriate to the student's knowledge and skill level without further licensure or certification.
- SECTION 7: All providers of medical services in the State of Nevada are authorized to practice outside the scope of their specialization, within the limits of their competency, to the extent necessary to augment and bolster Nevada's healthcare system during the COVID-19 crisis.
- SECTION 8: The Governor authorizes the Chief Medical Officer or his designee to review and approve the Crisis Standards of Care Guidance for COVID-19 promulgated by the State of Nevada Department of Health and Human Services, Division of Public and Behavioral Health, and the Governor's COVID-19 Medical Advisory Team.
- SECTION 9: All regulatory requirements for providers of medical services that are not compatible with the applicable Crisis Standards of Care approved by the Chief Medical Officer during this declared emergency will be suspended.
- SECTION 10: All providers of medical services related to COVID-19 are performing services for emergency management subject to the order or control of and at the request of State Government and shall be afforded the immunities and protections set forth in NRS 414.110, subject to the same exclusions therein.
- SECTION 11: All licensing fees assessed on providers of medical services by the State of Nevada or professional licensing boards shall be waived for all persons applying to practice in the State of Nevada pursuant to this Directive, for the duration that this Directive shall be in effect. Providers of medical services currently licensed by the State of Nevada may, at their election, delay submission of outstanding licensing fees for the period this Directive shall be in effect, except that no person who has paid the fee prior to the date of this Directive shall be entitled to a refund thereof by virtue of this order. No


license for a provider of medical services shall be suspended for nonpayment of licensing fees while this Directive is in effect, and for a period of 60 days thereafter.


SECTION 12: No license for a provider of medical services shall be suspended for any administrative reasons, including without limitation, continuing education requirements while this Directive is in effect, and for a period of 60 days thereafter. This restriction shall not be construed to prohibit the suspension or revocation of licenses for reasons that jeopardize patient health, including without limitation, incompetency or malpractice.

SECTION 13: This Directive shall remain in effect until specifically modified or terminated by a subsequent Directive promulgated pursuant to the March 12, 2020 Declaration of Emergency to facilitate the State's response to the COVID-19 pandemic.


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### **Administration Procedures**


1. General terms. The exam consists of 50 multiple-choice questions, is open-book, with a 3-hour time limit. You must receive at least a 75% to pass the exam. You are able to change your answers and go back to previous questions. Once the exam is submitted, your answers are final.
2. Scheduling of Testing Date/Time
  - a. Candidates shall schedule a time to take the exam with the Board office. Once scheduled, candidates shall receive a Zoom meeting link for the scheduled time of the exam.
3. Administration of the Exam
  - a. On the date/time of the exam, the Zoom meeting connection shall be established by the Board Office.
  - b. Once established, the candidate shall receive an email with a link to begin the exam. The exam may not be started until or unless the proctor provides permission to begin.
4. Proctoring Procedures
  - a. While taking the exam, the camera and microphone on the candidate's device must remain open for the proctor to monitor while the exam is taken. To minimize disruption, the candidate may minimize the video screen so that the proctor is not visible.
  - b. As this is an online exam, the candidate may refer to notes or the internet. However, they may not write or record any notes. The use of a pencil, pen or other writing or recording device, may result in the exam being canceled. In that case, the candidate must reschedule and may be required to pay the exam fee again.
  - c. The candidate may not speak to anyone during the exam. The proctor shall not respond to questions related to the exam.
  - d. Once the exam is concluded and/or the 3-hour time limit is reached, inform the proctor and leave the zoom meeting.
  - e. If the internet connection is disrupted at any time during the test, the exam will be considered void and a new appointment must be scheduled.





### ELIGIBILITY AND FEES

A candidate is eligible to take the state exam:

- As a psychological assistant once they have earned and submitted 1,400 post-doc supervised hours; or
- once the application for psychology licensure has been completed and approved by the Board Office.

The fee for the state examination is \$200.00 payable prior to the examination. This fee is required *each* time the examination is taken.

### PURPOSE OF THE STATE EXAMINATION

The purpose of the state exam is to identify persons who possess the minimum qualifications, knowledge necessary to be license-worthy in the State of Nevada, promote the competent practice of psychology in Nevada, and ensure public welfare.

## PSYCHOLOGY STATE EXAMINATION

NRS 641.180 allows the State of Nevada Board of Psychological Examiners to require that all candidates for a license as a psychologist: 1) Must pass the national examination, meaning the Examination for Professional Practice in Psychology (EPPP); and 2) May be required to take an examination in whatever applied or theoretical fields it deems appropriate. The Board has elected to administer a state examination addressing the practice of professional psychology, including, without limitation, federal and state laws, ethical principles and codes of professional conduct relevant to the practice of psychology in this State. All candidates for a license as a psychologist are required to take the state examination.

## ONLINE OPEN BOOK EXAM

### EXAMINATION DATES & LOCATIONS

The state examination is offered online. However, an appointment to take the exam must be made through the Board Office. Typically, appointments will be available during regular office hours on Fridays. The exam will not be scheduled until payment for the exam has been made.

### GENERAL

- The state examination passing score is 75%.
- The examination consists of 50 multiple choice questions
- The test taker shall have 3 hours to complete the exam.

### SPECIAL ACCOMMODATIONS

While an applicant may apply to the Board for approval for special accommodations in attempting the EPPP Part 1 and Part-2, it is generally not necessary for this exam. Requests for an accommodation may be made to the Board Office and require approval of the Board.

### STATISTICAL DATA

The examination, in its present multiple-choice format, was first administered in May 2020. As the format is new, no median state pass rate is available at this time but will be available after 50 attempts have been made.

### **When will the results of the exam be released?**

Examinees may receive notice of their score at the completion of the exam. The week following the attempt a letter will be provided from the Board office reiterating the score and providing information regarding the next steps in the application process.

### **How long will it take to receive my wall license once my licensure application is approved?**

A copy of your license will be mailed within 2 weeks after receipt of biennial license fee. Biennial fees are prorated to the remainder of the licensing biennial. The current biennium ends on December 31, 2022.

### **If I do not pass the state exam, how soon after may I re-take the exam.**

Generally, a candidate may attempt the state exam once in a month. The Board Office shall select the testing periods.

### **Does the online exam have additional fees?**

No, the examination fee of \$200.00 will cover all costs.

## **EXAMINATION POLICIES AND PROCEDURES**

Invitations to the state exam will be sent to qualified applicants, generally by email. Applicants are required to respond to the invitation to maintain an open application with the Board. An appointment to take the exam may be made once the examination fee is received by the Board office.

For security purposes, the online exam will be proctored by Board staff. (see below) Additional information on this process will be provided at the time the testing appointment is made. Once the exam has begun an individual may not leave without the score being submitted once the exam has begun. Each exam has a three-hour time limit.

Once the exam is submitted, the examinee will receive a notification from the examination of their final score. Within one week, a letter will be sent from the Board office notifying the individual of the exam score and the next steps in the application/licensure process.

## **TEST SECURITY**

Each candidate shall be required to sign a security/confidentiality agreement that includes, but is not limited to, prohibiting the recording of any portion of the exam and/or the reproduction of or aiding in the unauthorized reproduction of any portion of the exam.

The administration of the State Exam includes an online test proctoring component. This may include monitoring the test administration via a live proctor through online meeting software (e.g. Zoom, Teams).

Test takers shall be asked to show identification prior to beginning the exam.

## Examination Specifications

Examination specifications identify the content areas to be examined and are assigned a weight (percentage) based upon their relative importance to the practice of psychology in Nevada. For example, if the weight is 16%, approximately 16% of the test questions will reflect that content area. The state examination has seven content areas:

### Federal Law

Relevant federal laws include the Health Insurance Portability and Accountability Act, Patriot Act, Americans with Disability Act, and Title VII of the Civil Rights Act.

### Ethical Principles of Psychologists and Code of Conduct

Per NAC 641.250, the Board has adopted the provisions set forth in the most recent edition of the American Psychological Association's (APA) Ethical Principles of Psychologists and Code of Conduct. These may be accessed on the APA's Internet site, at [www.apa.org/ethics/code/index.aspx](http://www.apa.org/ethics/code/index.aspx).

## PREPARING TO TAKE THE STATE EXAM

The state exam has changed to an online open-book format. All the information an individual would need to pass the exam can be found in NAC 641, NRS 641, NRS relevant sections (below), and the APA code of ethics. A review of both Health Insurance Portability and Accountability Act (HIPPA) and American Disability Act (ADA) policies is also recommended.

The exam consists of questions from the following categories:

1. **Confidentiality and Mandatory Reporting** (20%) – Development, communication, and maintenance of patient confidentiality, limits of confidentiality, privilege, and mandatory reporting of child, older, and vulnerable person abuse, neglect, exploitation, and isolation.
2. **Record Keeping and Handling** (12%) – Development, retention, storage, release, and disposal of clinical records (e.g. treatment, testing, consultation, supervision, and billing records) according to federal and state laws and judicial decisions, regulations, and professional standards.
3. **Patient Rights and Informed Consent** (18%) – Protection, advocacy, and communication of patient rights, the process of informed consent and assent, the withdrawal of consent and assent, the right to receive treatment in the least restrictive environment, and the right to refuse treatment.
4. **Professional Standards of Conduct, Scope of Practice, and Professional Boundaries** (18%) –Professional practice in accordance with standards of conduct, practice guidelines, federal and state laws and judicial decisions that affect the practice of psychology; practicing within competency/specialty areas and areas of licensure; maintenance of appropriate boundaries (e.g. multiple relationships, dual roles and); and ethical decision-making.
5. **Licensing and Supervision** (16%) – Adherence to rules, regulations, requirements, and disciplinary process pertaining to licensure and practice before the State of Nevada Board of Psychological Examiners; and supervision of psychological assistants, interns, and auxiliary staff.
6. **Risk Assessment and Management of Dangerousness** (16%) – Assessment of risk and dangerousness to self and others (e.g. suicidality, homicidally), management of dangerousness (e.g. safety planning, duty to warn and protect, psychiatric hospitalization, emergency admission, and involuntary court-ordered admission).

## NEVADA STATE BOARD OF PSYCHOLOGICAL EXAMINERS

### Application for Licensure by Endorsement Procedure

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#### Purpose

In accordance with Nevada state law (NRS 641.195), this procedure describes the process by which an individual may apply for licensure as a psychologist by endorsement through the Nevada State Board of Psychological Examiners ("Board").

#### Definitions

1. Endorsement. Licensure by endorsement refers to the licensing of an individual who is already licensed to work as a psychologist in another state or jurisdiction.

#### Procedure

1. Licensure by endorsement is meant to be an expedited application process which takes into account a candidate's licensure in another jurisdiction, length of time the candidate has been licensed while ensuring the provisions of Nevada laws and regulations related to such licensure have been met.
2. Application
  - a. An application for a license by endorsement as a psychologist in the State of Nevada may be submitted if the applicant:
    - i. Holds a corresponding valid, active and unrestricted license as a psychologist in the District of Columbia or any state or territory of the United States;
    - ii. Possesses qualifications that are substantially similar to the qualifications required licensure in Nevada; and
    - iii. Satisfies any other applicable requirements under Nevada laws and regulations or policies of the Board.
  - b. An applicant **must** submit, in a manner determined by the Board:
    - i. Proof that the applicant satisfies the requirements for licensure in Nevada, including, that the applicant:
      1. Holds a doctorate degree in psychology from a graduate program that is accredited by the American Psychological Association or is an equivalent program. The program must also be regionally accredited.
      2. Has at least 2 years of supervised experience satisfactory to the Board. One year shall be an internship in which the

applicant has earned 2,000 supervised training hours; and one year shall be a postdoctoral experience in which the applicant has earned 1,750 supervised training hours.

- a. If an applicant has been licensed for at least 5 years in the District of Columbia or another state or territory of the United States and has had no disciplinary action or other adverse action taken against them by the regulatory body, the 2 years of experience may be reduced to require not less than 1,500 hours in each of the internship and postdoctoral years;
3. Has obtained a score of 500 or higher on the Examination for Professional Practice in Psychology (EPPP).
  4. Has passed the Nevada State Examination in Jurisprudence and Ethics in a manner prescribed by the Board.
  5. Holds a license in good standing in the jurisdiction in which the applicant currently holds a license as a psychologist. Proof of such license in good standing must be sent directly to the Board by that jurisdiction and may not be provided by the applicant.
  6. Has not been disciplined or investigated, held civilly or criminally liable for malpractice, had a license to engage in the practice of psychology suspended or revoked, been refused a license to engage in the practice of psychology, and/or does not have pending any disciplinary action concerning their license to engage in the practice of psychology by the corresponding regulatory authority of the District of Columbia or any state or territory in which the applicant currently holds or has held a license as a psychologist.
- ii. A complete set of fingerprints for the processing of a criminal background check and written permission authorizing the Board to forward the fingerprints in the manner provided by state law; and
  - iii. Any fees established by the Board for application, licensure, and issuance of a license.
- c. An applicant **may** be required to submit any other information required by the Board, in a manner prescribed by the Board.

### 3. Application and Review.

- a. The requirements for licensure in another U.S. state, territory or the District of Columbia are subject to change. As a result, the provisions below are subject to change.
- b. Substantially Similar Licensure Requirements (“Green”)
  - i. Refers to any state or territory whose qualifications are substantially similar to the qualifications required for issuance of a license in Nevada, including pre-doctoral internship with 2,000 hours; and postdoctoral fellowship with 1,750 hours for a total of 3,750 hours.
  - ii. Such applicants may utilize the Non-Standard Application Process that may include, but not be limited to, submission of:
    1. Character Reference Forms
    2. Verification of Current Licensure
    3. Transcripts (upon request)
    4. Proof of Continuing Education (upon request)
  - iii. “Green state” applications shall be processed by the Board Office and approved by the Board.
  - iv. Green states are Arkansas, Georgia, Hawaii, Kansas, Louisiana, Mississippi, New Jersey, New York, Tennessee (Health Service Provider only), Texas, Washington DC.
- c. Substantially Equivalent Licensure Requirements (“Yellow”)
  - i. Refers to any state or territory whose qualifications are substantially equivalent to the qualifications required for issuance of a license in Nevada pre-doctoral internship with 1,500 hours and postdoctoral fellowship with 1,500 hours for a total of 3,000 hours.
  - ii. Such applicants may utilize the Non-Standard Application Process that may include, but not be limited to, submission of:
    1. Character Reference Forms
    2. Verification of Current Licensure
    3. Transcripts (upon request)
    4. Proof of Continuing Education (upon request)



- 
- a. Holds a corresponding valid and unrestricted license as a psychologist in the District of Columbia or any state or territory of the United States.
  - b. Submits, in a manner prescribed by the Board:
    - i. Proof that the applicant has not been disciplined or investigated, or been held civilly or criminally liable for malpractice, by the corresponding regulatory authority of the District of Columbia or the state or territory of the United States;
    - ii. A complete set of fingerprints and written permission authorizing the Board to forward the fingerprints in the manner provided by state law; and
    - iii. Any fees established by the Board for application, licensure, and issuance of a license.
  - c. At any time before making a final decision on an application for a license by endorsement for an active member of, or the spouse of an active member of, the Armed Forces of the United States, a veteran, or the surviving spouse of a veteran applicant, the Board may grant a provisional license authorizing an applicant to practice as a psychologist in accordance with regulations adopted by the Board.
5. Approval of Application
- a. Approval of a license by endorsement as a psychologist shall only be issued pursuant to action of the Board.
  - b. The Board shall delegate to the Office of the Board administrative tasks including receipt and review of the application and associated documents.
6. Denial of Application
- a. The Board may deny an application for licensure by endorsement if:
    - i. The applicant does not meet requirements for licensure in the State of Nevada (NRS 641.195) and the deficiencies fall outside of what can be reasonably remediated;
    - ii. The applicant completed an exclusively online program;
    - iii. The applicant failed to complete any required portion of the application process following appropriate notification to the applicant of one or more deficiencies;
    - iv. There is evidence of fraud or misrepresentation of qualifications; and/or

- v. The applicant fails to comply with all applicable statutory and regulatory rules related to the practice of psychology in Nevada.
- 7. Special Accommodations, if any, should be requested of the Board at the time of application. Application for disability accommodations is available from the Board office.
- 8. This policy and the provisions within shall be reviewed on an annual basis.

Staff Performance Evaluation Procedure**

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### **Purpose**

In accordance with Nevada state law (NRS 641.045), this procedure describes the process for reviewing the performance of the staff of the Nevada State Board of Psychological Examiners ("Board").

### **Definitions**

1. "Staff member" refers to a permanent staff member(s) in the Board office. It does not include Board investigators, temporary employees, or independent contractors/consultants.
2. "Work Performance Standards" are written statements of the results and/or behavior expected of an employee when the job elements are satisfactorily performed under existing working conditions. Standards are required for all positions, and employees will be provided with a copy of the standards for their positions.

### **Procedure**

1. The staff performance evaluation process is based on the principle that performance should be evaluated on a regular basis in order to provide recognition of effective performance and as a tool to provide guidance in improving future performance.
2. Executive Director Performance Evaluation
  - a. Evaluation of the Executive Director shall be conducted by the Board President. If the Board President is not able or available to conduct the evaluation, the Secretary-Treasurer shall conduct the evaluation.
  - b. The Executive Director shall have the opportunity to provide a self-evaluation and to comment on the evaluation prior to review by the Board. The Board President will discuss the evaluation with the Executive Director and provide him/her with a copy.
  - c. The Executive Director shall sign the final evaluation, indicating that he/she has reviewed the document and discussed it with the Board President. The signature does not indicate agreement with the ratings or comments.
  - d. The Board shall formally review and take action on the annual evaluation in a publicly noticed meeting.

- e. The performance review of the Executive Director shall be conducted on an annual basis, generally in March/April for review by the Board in May/June.
  - i. In the Executive Director's first year of employment, the Board President may conduct informal performance reviews on a quarterly basis until the start of the new fiscal year. At such time, the annual evaluation calendar shall begin.
- f. If an evaluation rating of "Needs Improvement" is given, another evaluation must be completed within 90 days. The rating may affect adjustments in salary based on merit and longevity pay.
- g. Rating System
  - i. Outstanding. Performance significantly exceeds the Board's expectations due to the efforts and ability of the Executive Director when considering the job in its entirety. Significantly above-standard performance may be exhibited by consistently completing assignments in advance of deadlines; implementing plans and/or procedures to increase efficiency or effectiveness of work; working independently with little direction; and consistently meeting Board goals.
  - ii. Above Average. Performance exceeds the Board's expectations due to the efforts and ability of the Executive Director when considering the job in its entirety. Performance is beyond what is expected of an Executive Director in this position.
  - iii. Average. Performance meets the minimum expectations of the Board. The Executive Director adequately performs the duties and responsibilities of the position.
  - iv. Needs Improvement. The Executive Director's performance fails to meet the Board's minimum expectations due to lack of effort and/or ability when considering the job in its entirety. Performance requires improvement in numerous and/or important aspects of the position.
  - v. Not Applicable. Rater is unable to assess the Executive Director in this area, or the area is not applicable to the employee's job.

### 3. Office Staff Performance Evaluation

- a. Evaluation of other office staff shall be conducted by the Executive Director.

- b. Staff shall have the opportunity to provide a self-evaluation and to comment on his/her evaluation prior to review and discussion with the Executive Director. The Executive Director will discuss the evaluation with the staff member and provide him/her with a copy.
  - c. The staff member shall sign the final evaluation, indicating that he/she has reviewed the document and discussed it with the Executive Director. The signature does not indicate agreement with the ratings or comments.
  - d. The Board shall formally review and take action on the annual evaluation in a publicly noticed meeting.
  - e. The performance review shall be conducted on an annual basis, generally in March/April for review by the Board in May/June.
    - i. In a staff member's first year of employment, the Executive Director may conduct informal performance reviews on a quarterly basis until the start of the new fiscal year. At such time, the annual evaluation calendar shall begin.
  - f. Rating System. The rating system for office staff shall mirror that of the executive director using the ratings categories of Outstanding, Above Average, Average, Needs Improvement, and Not Applicable.
  - g. The performance review of staff shall be conducted on an annual basis, generally in April.
    - i. Employees in their first year of employment shall be considered probationary and will be every three months until the start of the new fiscal year. At such time, the annual evaluation calendar shall begin.
4. Disputes
- a. The Executive Director may discuss any concerns or questions related to the evaluation conducted by the Board President with the Board during the publicly noticed meeting. The finding of the Board is final, and no further appeal of the evaluation is available.
  - b. Staff may bring any concerns or questions related to the evaluation conducted by the Executive Director to the Board during the publicly noticed meeting. The finding of the Board is final, and no further appeal of the evaluation is available.
5. Records Retention. The original copy of any evaluation will be maintained by the Board Office, in the Executive Officer or other staff member's Personnel File.

6. See Board Policy "Employment, Compensation, and Evaluation" for information related to annual pay increases and disputes related to performance evaluation.

## Staff Report:

Staff is reviewing the information in the database to ensure accuracy and consistency in the recording of licensee information, including disciplinary information.

The terms "expired" and "suspended" have not been used consistently nor is the use of the discipline tab related to the category "suspended." Below are screen shots as examples. One is expired and is noted as discipline, one is suspended with no discipline noted, and the third is suspended with discipline noted. For the two that have discipline noted, one is for non-renewal and one is for non-response.

NRS 641.222 calls for the automatic suspension of a license is not paid within 60 days of the expiration date. (see below) However, the provision for renewal of a license, and the subsequent suspension for failure to renew, is not found under Discipline nor is it listed as discipline in our policy.

### Should failure to renew:

- be listed as an expired license with no discipline
- be listed as a suspended license with no discipline
- be listed as a suspended license with discipline
  - Failure to renew
  - Failure to respond to communication from Board (office)

At least two individuals during the last renewal voluntarily let their licenses expire stating they were not practicing in Nevada (retired, moved).

**ED Recommendation:** That the Board of Psychological Examiners deem failure to renew a license be marked in the licensee database as an EXPIRED license. The term SUSPENDED shall only refer to disciplinary matters in the licensee database.

**NRS 641.222 Automatic suspension of psychologist's license for failure to pay biennial fee for renewal of license; reinstatement; notice of suspension.**

1. The license of any person who fails to pay the biennial fee for the renewal of a license within 60 days after the date when it is due is automatically suspended. The Board may, within 2 years after the date the license is so suspended, reinstate the license upon payment to the Board of the amount of the then current biennial fee for the renewal of a license and the amount of the fee for the restoration of a license so suspended. If the license is not reinstated within 2 years, the Board may reinstate the license only if it also determines that the holder of the license is competent to practice psychology.

2. A notice must be sent to any person who fails to pay the biennial fee, informing the person that the license is suspended.

SUMMARY—Revises provisions governing mental health records. (BDR 54-456)

AN ACT relating to mental health; exempting recordings of certain training activities from requirements concerning the retention, maintenance and disclosure of health care records; and providing other matters properly relating thereto.

**Legislative Counsel's Digest:**

Existing law imposes various requirements concerning the retention, maintenance and disclosure of health care records, including the patient or client records of a psychologist, marriage and family therapist, clinical professional counselor, social worker, independent social worker, clinical social worker, clinical alcohol and drug counselor, alcohol and drug counselor or problem gambling counselor. (NRS 629.051-629.069) This bill provides that a program of education for such mental health professionals approved by the applicable licensing board, a mental health professional or a person receiving training for mental health professionals is not required to retain a recording of the provision of services by such a mental health professional to a patient if: (1) the recording is used for a training activity; (2) the patient has provided informed consent to the use of the recording in the training activity; and (3) discarding the recording does not result in the maintenance of incomplete patient records.

*(b) The client has provided informed consent to the use of the recording in the training activity; and*



*(c) Discarding the recording does not result in noncompliance with the obligations described in subsection 2.*

*2. The provisions of this section do not abrogate, alter or otherwise affect the obligation of a clinical alcohol and drug counselor, alcohol and drug counselor or problem gambling counselor to retain records concerning the mental health services that he or she provides to clients in accordance with NRS 629.051 to 629.069, inclusive.*

*3. As used in this section, "mental health professional" means a psychologist, marriage and family therapist, clinical professional counselor, social worker, independent social worker, clinical social worker, clinical alcohol and drug counselor, alcohol and drug counselor or problem gambling counselor.*

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AN ACT relating to behavioral health; authorizing the issuance of a provisional license or certificate to engage in various professions relating to behavioral health to an applicant who meets certain requirements; requiring licensing boards that regulate such professions to report certain information; providing for the issuance of a license as a master social worker to an applicant who meets certain qualifications; authorizing a master social worker or independent social worker to engage in certain activities; prescribing required documentation for an applicant for a license to engage in social work who is the graduate of a foreign college or university; authorizing the Board of Examiners for Social Workers to place a license to engage in social work on inactive status and refuse to issue a license under certain circumstances; requiring an employee of the Board to submit a complaint against a licensee to the Board under certain circumstances; prohibiting a person from engaging in the unlicensed practice of social work; providing for a study of certain licensing and certification procedures; providing a penalty; and providing other matters properly relating thereto.



**Legislative Counsel's Digest:**

1 Existing law authorizes the issuance of a provisional license as a psychologist,  
2 clinical professional counselor, social worker, clinical social worker, independent
